Treasurer's report:

James Haling presented the report dated 12th August 2016 showing a total balance of accounts of \$28,159.24 Invoices from members for payment were advised and acceptance of these and the financial report were proposed.

Membership report: James Haling reported that there were now 124 financial members plus 3 widow members who receive the Club newsletter free.

Events report:

Ken Young reported on events. The Xmas In July event was very well arranged by Phil Dalton with much effort put in by Phil and his family with the decorations. Unfortunately attendance was disappointing. Tom Virgona commented on the quality of the food which members felt was not up to the usual standard. Phil will consider with the committee whether another venue might attract more members. In addition to this event Phil also contributed by working without a break on All Fords Day.

Maintenance Day at the Wyborns was well attended and there was a lot of interest in Bryan's collection of vehicles. Marguerite and Bryan were thanked by Rob Taylor for arranging the BBQ on the day.

Tickets were still available at \$20 from Treasurer Jim Haling for the CMC/ Shannons Day on the 14th August.

The Club run to the Maroota Muster on the 21st August is going ahead and is likely to be well supported.

Ken Young was of the opinion that the Bowral Tulip Festival would present a parking problem for the Club in view of the expected very large public attendance and felt we should attend the Lions Club Lugarno Fair on the 18th September instead. Jim Allingham undertook to notify the organizers of our attendance and Rob Taylor nominated 15 cars as likely to attend.

Jim Allingham is arranging Memorial Day on the 16th October at the Prince Edward Park at Woronora.

The event for November 20th is being planned by Trevor Davis for the Wiseman's area.

The visit to Shoalhaven Heads in December has been cancelled and a replacement event is needed.

Wednesday Wanderer's report:

Library report:

This had been made for display at the Xmas in July lunch and as there was limited storage at the meeting room he suggested that he store it at home on behalf of the club.

CMC report: Phil Dalton advised that Model A's will be in section B at the CMS Shannons Classic at Eastern Creek on 14th August. RMS require that Historic registered vehicles have two rear reflectors.

General business: Ron Williams enquired about the progress of the 40th Year History of the club and asked if it was intended that the \$500 donation by Darren Cook in memory of his parents be used to publish this history for members. Trevor Davis advised that the history had been finished about 6 weeks ago and had been forwarded to Alan Hale to place on the website. He had sent an email the previous day and discovered that Alan had not received the article. The committee has yet to consider what formats of the history apart from the website should be available to members. Tom Virgona explained how he recovered his finger intact when it became jammed inside a Model A motor and help was unavailable.

There is under consideration a classification for inclusion of historic vehicles which are modified. Mention was made of the log book system and it was thought that it would be advisable that it be used also when road testing and on visits to the local garage until clarification is received from RMS. Some clubs are experiencing some problems with websites which could amount to fraud.

General business:

Kevin Churchill, the President of the Model A Ford Club of Victoria Inc has requested if that Club could hold the 2020 National Meet instead of our club. This would enable the event to coincide with 100 years since Ford Australian production began at Geelong. The event therefore was intended to be held at Geelong. John Hyland expressed the view that if our event was held in 2022 there might be a problem as some of our members could be too old to assist with planning and organization of our event.

Trevor Davis informed members that he just recently learnt that Marie & John Hyland were celebrating their 50th year of marriage on 11th June and wished to congratulate them.
