

Technical Comments

Oil Leaks at the Rear Main Bearing. Most will probably agree that such leaks are one of the most troublesome aspects of the Model A. It is probable that the leaks experienced by many may not have been entirely due to a design fault but rather develop during the service life of the Model A. Ford did increase the size of the rear main bearing cap drain pipe from 5/16 to 3/8 inches, this being the only known modification during 4 years of production in response to the problem. Some owners in desperation have fitted a seal which can work well for a couple of years before sometimes starting to leak again, particularly if the motor is not used frequently. To fit a seal the oil slinger has to be removed by machining to provide space.

In the Model A News of July-August 2009, which is the official publication of The Model A Restorers Club, there appears an article titled 'The "Fix" for a rear main oil leak'. The fix consists of making an oil groove of the same width and depth as the regular oil groove about 1/4 inch from the rear edge of the bearing cap and drilling a 5/32 inch hole exactly at the bottom of the groove down through the babbitt metal, making sure to drill into the drain trough but not completely through it. It is claimed this modification has worked well for a number of Model A owners. I checked this out with a contact who many years ago worked for a firm which overhauled motors and he advised that this was a common practice.

Les Andrews, who for many years has been a member of MAFCA & MARC, is a well known and respected authority on the Model A and believes that with proper assembly and tolerances the rear main seal will not leak. In an article which has come to my attention he has developed a method for investigating leaks at the rear main bearing assembly. With the engine out of the vehicle the pressure plate, clutch and bell housing are removed to enable clear inspection of the rear main area. The oil filler pipe is covered using a piece of rubber from an inner tube and a hose clamp, and about 40 psi air pressure is applied through the dipstick hole. Using a squirt bottle, soapy water is applied around the rear main area and any leaks are noted. If these are found the engine pan and crankshaft are removed to permit closer examination. In the next Flyer a list of common deficiencies identified by Les will be provided. Also included will be a list of what to check for if intending to have main bearings re-poured. In addition information will be provided on the checks on reassembly which hopefully will ensure an oil leak free engine. If any member wants copies
