Technical Comment On Front Wheel Bearings

Recently when replacing front wheel bearings it was attributed to bearing races not seating properly on found that hub outer bearing races went in for approximately 95 percent of full travel and then met extreme resistance. In the first photograph, compari-

installation.

The method used here to overcome the problem was





son of the upside down view of the new race on the left with the old race on the right reveals a difference in the contour of the corner edges. Due to practical limitations the photograph on the right of the inner surface of the hub cannot demonstrate clearly why the radius of the corner of the hub internal shoulder against which the race must bottom can result in an interference problem. However for illustration purposes the photograph may help to visualise why.

How common this problem is not known. However there have been cases experienced by others where occurrence of loose front wheel bearings have been

to push the race in as far as it will go, without using excessive force, then remove it and look for an interference contact mark on the lower part of the inner wall of the hub. Using a miniature hand held grinder fitted with a small stone, metal was then removed at that spot. This process was repeated several times until the race bottomed on the shoulder of the hub. To inspect that the race is correctly seated it is advisable to use a small inspection mirror to look at the contact interface. It is good fitting practice that any bearing race, wherever used, be checked in this way.
