Wednesday Wanderer's Report

1st July, Wednesday 2009. Charles Darwin - Voyages and Ideas That Shook the World. National Maritime Museum. Technical Comments

Flathead Ted's Brakes. Further news has been heard of this modification due to the experience of a MARC member at Canberra. In this case the installation went well without any problems. Members are asked to keep us informed of their experience as this may help others to decide if they wish to purchase the kit. Hopefully we should be able soon to establish a consensus for your consideration.

Tyre Pressures. Ford recommends that tyre pressures be maintained at 35 lbs per square inch. This appears to be all too embracing as Model A tare weights and loading vary, and also tyres manufactured by various manufacturers vary. Inspection of the wear of rear tyres is a good way to decide if tyre pressure overall should be altered. Why? Wear of rear tyres is virtually unaffected by steering alignment problems. More wear seen on the centre of the tread compared with the outer edges indicates that a lower pressure should be tried. Conversely less wear in the centre of the tread indicates that a higher pressure should be tried. If the front tyres are not badly scrubbed due to misalignment it should be possible to determine if these tyres are being over or under inflated.

Adjusting Toe In. Experience gained over many years suggests that too much faith is placed by Model A owners in using an adjustable measuring rod to set the toe in of the front wheels. Even adjustment by steering alignment professionals using better equipment has been found to give false results. Many homemade adjustable measuring rods show considerable ingenuity in their construction. Owners of such devices firmly believe in them but unfortunately this is an illusion. The reason for wrong results is that the method is one of measurement either between the inner side of the front tyres or between the edges of the rims, all of which usually provide irregular measuring points. Typically if one considers that the distance between the front wheel rims to be of the order of 1305 millimetres and the toe in to be measured is of the order of 3 millimetres, then the potential for measurement error can be very high.

There is fortunately no need to use the above method as a simple alternative is available. This method is based on the fact that a mark placed on the tread on any tyre will travel in a perfect circle when rotated, irrespective of any wobble or other irregularities present. There is a proviso however and that is there is no movement due to loose wheel bearings. If so the bearings should be adjusted.

The method is as follows. Glue a small piece of paper, such as that made by a hole punch, on the tread of each tyre at the same height from the ground. A small dot is made with an ink pen on each piece of paper and with the aid of a helper the distance between the two dots is measured with a steel tape. The measurement is made again with the wheels rotated to the rear. The difference in the two measurements is the toe in. With care this method can give a reading accuracy better than one millimetre particularly if zero on the tape is taken as some offset value ie say the 100 millimetre mark. Those who remain unconvinced that their method is flawed should carry out this measurement using the tape. It is believed the results will surprise even the unconverted. (by Trevor Davis)
