20th June, Sunday 2010. Visit To Baha'i Temple, Ingleside.



Technical Comments

Noise From The Timing Gear: If the timing gear is suspected to be the cause of a clicking noise, Mal Bradley has suggested a test to isolate the problem. Take out the timing pin, reverse it and push hard against the timing gear. If the noise disappears it is likely that the timing gear is defective or worn. There is an element of danger however in doing this with the motor running because of proximity to the fan. It is advisable to crank the engine over by hand and push in the timing pin reversed as previously. It may be found that a click occurs at the same spot every two turns of the crankshaft and this is because of the gear ratio (cont)

between the crankshaft gear and the timing gear. The click is due to the force of valve springs on the camshaft lobes causing a small rotation wherever excessive clearance occurs between the gear teeth.

Upper Goose Neck Failure.

The Model A goose neck casting is very prone to snapping at either of the flange lugs due to a design weakness. Over the years many castings have failed in service. Failure happens because of the bending forces exerted by the two cylinder head bolts if any gasket has been installed between the casting and the cylinder head. The gasket will compress more at the lugs and least in the region in between thus stressing the flange. Even though the Model A was designed to have this gasket, if you have such a gasket in place, we recommend you remove it to avoid future trouble and replace it with Silastic gasket maker or equivalent. Before doing so however check the flatness of the goose neck flange and correct it if necessary by filing or rubbing it on emery paper placed on a flat surface.
