

Earthing The Model A Headlamps.



Ford did not provide a definite connection from the headlights to the battery earthing point made on the chassis for both the Model T and the Model A. It was intended that current would flow from the lamp socket housing through the contact made with the lamp reflector to the headlamp shell, and possibly through the focus adjusting screw, through four steel rivets to the headlight swivel base, then though to the headlight bar, and thence through contact with the mudguards and then through to the chassis. It has been said that the return path for the earth current took many paths depending on the condition of the many metal to metal contacts and it was even claimed that the rear window frames on sedans could be part of the circuit. For a new vehicle and in the absence of rust these multiple contacts would still have performed very well.

A far better remedy is to run an earthing wire to the chassis.

Les Andrews's maintenance book suggests replacing one of the four steel rivets with a stainless steel bolt

at the headlight base. However this does not do anything for the remainder of the metal to metal contacts discussed previously and the following is suggested instead. For good earthing use a wire gauge rated at least 10 amps or higher. File part of the plating off the lamp socket to expose the brass beneath and solder the wire to it. Examine the headlight exit socket to find a way to feed the wire down the stainless steel conduit. There should be room to drill a hole through the ferrule insulator which carries the other wires to the headlight lamps. If the plug connection is being used it may be best to dispense with it and use separate wire connectors within the headlight shell. The plug connector system is a source of other problems so its retention is not of much importance. At the other end of the conduit run the earthing wire to that front hole in the chassis which takes a bolt for the splash pans. If the pans are still fitted the existing front bolt can still be used or, if not, provide a bolt for the earthing point.

The following steps are very important. Install a wire terminal by crimping or soldering to the earth wire. Put the bolt through the wire terminal and then follow this with a star washer under the wire terminal. Do not use a split washer because a star washer is needed to make a number of contacts with the wire terminal and also with the steel chassis. Clean the contact area of the chassis and install the assembly to the chassis with a nut. In most case however the star washer will penetrate any rust or grease present. Full reliance is placed upon the star washer to continue to provide an effective connection with time as its hard Due however to deterioration of these many metal to contacts provide a degree of cold fusion with the metal contacts with time it is a daunting prospect to chassis and the wire terminal. Another washer placed Because the earthing wire is mostly out of sight the modification does not detract from the appearance of the vehicle.
