


#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

# Join the Wanderers at their next outing

Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July – Japanese High Explosive Shell Damage Sites at Rose Bay. In the very early morning of 8th June 1942 the Rose Bay area was shelled by a Japanese submarine located off Malabar. Meet at the Quayside Gateway Food Court at Circular Quay for morning tea at 9 am. Travel by bus 326 leaving Stand D at Circular Quay at 10.10 am and alight at the corner of Plumer Rd and Balfour Rd, Rose Bay. (Note that the service is hourly.) Here there are two sites, one where a shell exploded and another where a shell failed to explode. Davis Travel Services will give a guided tour and provide a comprehensive information pack prior to the visit on request or on the day. Lunch is available locally and very little walking is involved. For planning purposes please advise your interest ASAP in case

many wish to attend.
