

14th -20th March 2010, 21st National Meet at Launceston.

Best attendance by a club went to the Western Australia Model A Restorers Club this time. I have forgotten now what the formula is for deciding the winner but we had no hope as only 12 Model As from our club made it to Launceston. Two of our cars failed along the way as mentioned in my report on page 1.









Our trip went well except for a frustrating time finding our way through the traffic mazes in Melbourne to the ferry berth at the bay beach and also on return from Launceston at Melbourne due to a traffic accident on the Westgate Bridge. Melbourne is like Sydney in that there are too many people trying to share the roads and all going at top speed wherever they can. In short a rat race!

At Launceston the meet headquarter was in a relatively new building on the North Esk River near its conjunction with the Tamar River. Parking was an unexpected problem which occurred with short notice to the organisers but we all coped well and the host club members pitched in to control and safeguard the cars. Amenities for drink and food and socialising were very good.
