UNDERSTANDING MODEL A ENGINE IGNITION TIMING

Those Model A drivers who fully advance and retard the timing lever with no intermediate setting used in between may find the following of interest. The Model A was designed to have a

(ie 1.5 milliseconds) in the reference book titled " Internal Combustion Engines " by R K Rajput, page 204. Maximum power and efficiency is obtained when the piston is at TDC at the end

timing range of 40 degrees of engine rotation but there is no evidence to show that the full range will ever be needed. In fact full advance can be detrimental to engine performance. Member Greg Cribbin has advised of comprehensive testing which has demonstrated that a maximum advance of 31 degrees before top dead centre (TDC) will accommodate the full range of performance required of the Model A. Greg advocates that the maximum advance



with the timing lever be set to 31 degrees and not 40 degrees. Performance with the timing lever fully retarded on idle for this setting does not appear to be of any consequence and actually seems to give smoother operation at crawling speeds.

not be fully understood by all Model A drivers. With experience it will be found the engine will fuel mixture does not detonate but burns during advance is as shown in the graph. a finite time called engine lag. This time is quoted as being of the order of 0.0015 seconds Compiled by Trevor Davis

of the burn cycle. This is because maximum gas pressure is developed when the combustion chamber has minimum volume ie with the piston at TDC..

Because the engine lag time is constant the amount of advance required varies proportionally with engine revolutions. At maximum engine revolutions of 3000 RPM the amount of advance needed is calculated 27 as degrees. This shows good correlation with the figure of 31 degrees obtained from the comprehensive testing referred to

above. Minor variations in actual burn time can be due to fuel chemistry, fuel mixture and several other factors which are beyond the scope of this article.

The conclusion is drawn that it is good driving practice to advance engine timing progressively as the engine speed (RPM) is increased and to The reason for advancing the timing lever may avoid excessive advancing of the timing lever. Of course you all knew of Henry Kendall the poet from your school days, or did you? Remember Kendall's poem "*Bellbirds*"?

By channels of coolness the echoes are calling,

And down the dim gorges I hear the creek falling etc.

Well Tom and Carol Virgona put on a great outing for sixteen of us by organizing a rail trip to the Henry Kendall Cottage and Historical Museum at Gosford. They even made a special trip beforehand to plan our visit and make sure everything went smoothly. But alas this was not to be. Our bus connection at the other end left before we arrived by rail which upset our schedule. Then when we arrived for lunch at Woy Woy the restaurant specially chosen by Tom and Carol had, without notice to them, closed for alterations. An information leaflet provided at the cottage museum told us that Henry Kendall was born 18 April 1839 in a settler's hut near Milton NSW.
