Technical Comment

Crankshaft pulley:





This article is a summary of events involving much hands on input from Tom Virgona, technical advice via telephone link to Mal Bradley plus moral support from Norm Bosher and the editor who stood around at the site of operations. The problem to be solved with the engine installed in the Model A was the removal of a crankshaft pulley which was excessively worn where the front engine seals rub. None of us relished the idea of trying to raise the front of the engine to clear the front cross member. The idea emerged that we might be able to use the two piece crankshaft pulley now available as part number B6312B. (See the first picture in which the new pulley has been painted.) This pulley is advertised that it can be installed without removing the radiator but it would have to be assumed that somehow the original one piece pulley had been removed. Our job therefore was to make the original pulley vanish. This was solved by Tom Virgona using a large diameter angle grinder after carefully making sure debris didn't get into the engine. (See the second photo of the original pulley shown cut in two.) There were problems with the new two piece pulley however. The rubbing surface in the area of the seals was not good and had to be polished. Also the pulley was found to be made of aluminium so a steel washer had to be installed to take the thrust of the crankshaft ratchet nut. At the start we had fun and games getting this nut undone. At the finish we also had fun getting the lower crankshaft seal out and

replacing it with a new one. That is another story however - life was not meant to be easy! by TD.
