Technical Comments

If replacing the cylinder head with the high compression 'police style' 5.5/1 head it is advised that high tensile head bolts made of chrome molybdenum steel be purchased and the correct head gasket be obtained as described and recommended in auto parts catalogues. Unfortunately there seems to be a quality problem with available head bolts as the lower thread centre line does not always coincide with the bolt centre line due to the thread forming method. Accordingly the bolts when installed into the engine block can lean at varying angles and prevent the gasket and cylinder head from being installed. Club member Mal Bradley came up with a solution. Check each head bolt when installed for squareness with the engine block using a square and adjust with gentle force using a rubber or fibre hammer, being careful not to get carried away and wreck the upper threads. You could also use a long steel tube of suitable dimensions placed over the head bolt and lever it into line.

Should valves need attention it may be found that the valve guides are difficult to remove. Sometimes if the guides have not been out for a long time the use of a removal tool as sold by auto parts suppliers may not be successful. This is because such a tool can not apply a force in direct line with the valve stem and the springiness due to the bent shape of the tool can defeat all efforts at removal. In such a case very drastic measures are required which of course will be expensive. Cover up all openings in the block and with an angle grinder cut off the heads of the valves. Club member Tom Virgona made a tool of robust proportions from round steel stock (ie reinforcing steel) having a hole drilled in one end long enough to fit over the remainder of the valve stem and make contact with the top of the valve guides. This tool will work wonders and new stainless steel valves will repair the damage.
