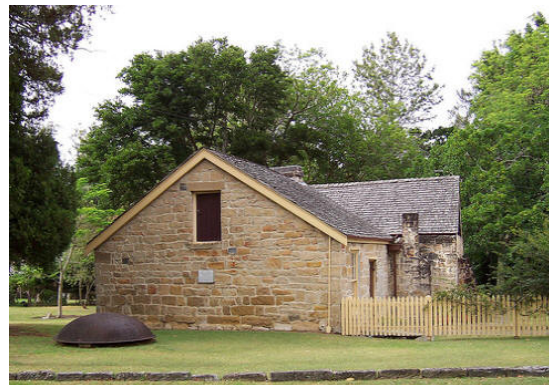
sorts of gear to see & a great movie with lot's of well known people telling their story. We returned to the GATEWAY for a leisurely lunch with lot's of chatter, as you do.
