

Technical Comment On Worn Dizzy Bushes



The replacement of worn distributor bushes can present a problem if a stepped removal driving tool is not available. Model A parts suppliers do not sell them. One method to get the bushes out is to screw a 14 mm intermediate tap into one bush as shown in the photograph and using a mild steel or brass rod drive the bush plus tap out from the opposite end. This is then repeated for the other bush.

TIP RE ADVANCE RETARD ROD REMOVAL REPLACEMENT

If you take the Model A steering box apart and have the two rods Advance/Retard and Hand Throttle levers out, it is near impossible to feed them back into their bottom two holes without putting a small bend in each! If you do bend them they tend to rattle in certain positions while you drive!

One easy way to overcome repositioning them is to find a piece of wire strong enough and long enough to reach from the top of the column and protrude out of the bottom holes. Bronze welding wire is suitable or similar. Next drill a hole in the bottom end of both rods which is appropriate to wedge the wire into. Feed the rods in from the top, lowering them together as the wires feed them into the bottom hole. Remove the wire and the job is done!

When doing this don't forget the Spark and Gas anti rattler - part number T-2913 - which you fit onto both rods before fitting them back into the column tube.





MODEL A PHAETON


Vic Ellis attended a couple of rallies with a friend then decided to restore a car himself. Here is his 1928 Model A Ford Phaeton.

Vic chose a Model A because he wanted a good reliable car that would not only be competitive at rallies but would also get him there and back. Also Model A parts were easily obtainable, even some new parts and as a consequence no problems were encountered with the restoration. Vic did all the work himself including the engine. The body he sprayed with Dulux enamel in maroon, the fenders he did black. To highlight the body cream pin striping is used. Upholstery in the car is black with maroon carpets on the floor. The top is also black. All brightwork has been restored in chrome by Street Electrics of Nhill.


An unusual feature of Model A's is the all steel body construction used in 1928-9. In 1930 Ford in Australia reverted to wooden framed bodies whereas the parent company in USA retained the steel.

Vic is a member of the Wimmera Motor Historical Vehicle Society.


MODEL A CABRIOLET






RESTORED

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A car which was never seen on Australian roads was the Model A Ford Cabriolet. This 1900 model was restored by New Zealander Ivan Bengt over a period of 5 years.

The nearest Australia had to the Cabriolet was the sport coupe which had full doors and a soft top but the top did not fold down. The Cabriolet however, had an unusual door with a front pillar but the rest of the glass area and trim would fold down as one. This combined with the folding top meant the Cabriolet could be very neatly converted into a roadster.

Ivan always wanted a Model A roadster or Cabriolet and came upon the latter first. He bought this car in 1965 for \$175 and completely rebuilt it with as many raw parts as he could get. This included motor, pistons, three new stub axles and a new radiator. The body was very poor so Ivan attended sight classes in panel beating for three years and during that time made all new floor panels. Bottom of body all round, wheelarches and he also made one new valence panel and running boards and a set of running board trim. Needless to say he was very pleased with that little lot.

The Model A is painted in Tacoma cream with horizontal brown moldings. Fenders are black and striping is off-white. Upholstery is brown vinyl done in 4-inch strips. Carpets are done in the front while black diamond pattern rubber covers the floor in the rambler seat. The hood is done in laen Hobbite material. The Murray Body Company made these unusual bodies for Ford. Ivan is a member of the Vintage Car Club of New Zealand, Wellington Branch.

Specifications are the same as other models in the range—4 cylinder L head engine, 8 inch single plate clutch, 3 speed gearbox, wheelbase is 103 1/2 inches. Only difference in suspension is the rear spring has more leaves—13 to the passenger cars, 7, 8 or 10.
