## A Model A Story

Max Nulley, who is the owner of the Lions Den Hotel in north Queensland, provided this photo to club member Barry Rose. The car had been in his family since new and he drives it regularly. From memory, he'd also driven it to Perth and back. I (as a car nut) was so impressed with his adventure (which he didn't think it was - he had no fan fare, not trying to prove anything, just

loved driving his car) that I asked if he'd park the old girl out front for a photo, which he did.

I asked him if he'd had any trouble with the car on the journey, he told me a blinker rattled loose near Birdsville! "

## Technical Comments

**Head gaskets & oil filters:** Member Richard Payne has advised the following. 'We have a high compression head and had to use a newer design gasket. Torqued it once only and after 5000 miles there has been no problems. Another thing that interested me when the engine was rebuilt, I installed one of the bypass oil filters that fits on the modified gear case. After 5000 it was removed and cut open. There was a significant amount of junk in it, so it must be working. I think with modern detergent oils the contaminants stay in suspension longer, which is why the filter picked them up. (Apology to Richard for being late with this.) **Painting Your Car:** I don't profess to be an expert on painting but rather an amateur who has made many mistakes along the way. However I do take a little pride in my workmanship even if it is not up to profes-

sional standards. Generally I will ask many questions and read as much as I can. Others have been a great help to me along the way. (cont next page) Getting to the point, I sprayed my Model T Ford last year and went to a lot of trouble to try and make a good job of it. It was therefore disappointing when after one year I started to notice blemishes which I am pretty certain were not there when it was finished. Where did these blemishes come from I asked myself as the body filling and undercoating were aspects which had been very carefully undertaken. I then remembered an article I had read many years ago and had largely forgotten. I had neglected to consider shrinkage!

Hopefully the following will help the reader to avoid this pitfall. The article appears in Volume 3 page 23 of the Restorer book titled "How To Restore Your Model A". In the article it is stated that "for a surface that will develop only the barest minimum of sand scratches on the final top coat the following schedule will work well but if you don't mind small flaws and sand scratches beginning to be visible in about 3 months then shorten it as you wish." (It does look a bit extreme but it is all a matter of patience and the result you want.)

#### Day

#### Primer - Surfacer Schedule Operation

1st Hand sand any body filler repairs with 60 grit paper, and spray 4 coats of primer/surfacer.

8th Block sand with 100 grit paper and spray 3 coats of primer/surfacer.

15th Block sand with 220 grit paper and spray 3 coats of primer/surfacer.

21st Block sand with 320 grit paper and spray 2 coats of primer/surfacer.

26th Block sand with 400 grit paper and spray 2 coats of primer /surfacer.

30th Hand sand with folded pad of 600 grit paper and spray colour top coats.
