Our 1929 Phaeton is a family car that my father and I bought from my mother's aunty in 1965.

My mother's uncle bought the car new from a dealer in Newcastle. He had one job on a sheep station in Manilla (near Tamworth) which he started as a teenager; he died while still working the same job at the age of 72, still working for the same family.

He and his wife didn't have any children, so he had one wife, one job and one car, 29 Model A Phaeton.

We are the second owners and it is still in the family. In the early days I drove it to work which was a bit of fun and to the beach a couple of times with friends. Due to family commitments the car was for some time housed beside a chicken shed and was home to a few rats and guinea pigs (the rear seat still has their entry and exit points showing). It was later put in a container where it was forgotten and unloved for some years. We need to thank the relatives in Annangrove who stored this container.

I have made a few modifications to our A to make it a little more user friendly--they are already reliable.

The best part about our A is all our new friends, the great help we have received from club members and all the social activities we have attended in the A.

But my biggest thank you must go to my wife Roz. Without her help, support and encouragement I would not have restored the Phaeton we share today.

A brief history of the Model A Ford

Riding the roads and the airwaves the Ford Model A was the subject of the 1928 song, "Henry's Made a

Lady Out of Lizzie," which sang the praises of Ford's new addition to the road.

The first Model A Ford engine, stamped "A1" by Henry Ford himself on October 20, 1927, was put in a Tudor Sedan that Ford personally drove and tested before giving final approval to begin production of the car. At Henry Ford's request, the engine was eventually placed in a 1928 Phaeton that was reserved in Dearborn for the use of his friend and fellow innovator, Thomas Edison.

The 20 Millionth Ford was a 1931 Ford Model A 160-B Slant Windshield Town Sedan. Accompanied off the assembly line by Henry and Edsel Ford, the black car was lettered on the sides and, so it could be seen from the air, the roof, with "The Twenty Millionth Ford." The Sedan would be taken on a tour of the U.S., stopping at nearly every Ford territory and dealer along the way. Rumoured to be lost in a fire sometime after the publicity tour, the car was discovered in Michigan in 1999. After Ford determined it was indeed "The Twenty Millionth Ford," the company agreed to lease the car from its current owner. Ford then devoted their resources to a complete restoration of the car in preparation for their 2003 Centennial celebration. As part of the lease agreement, the Town Sedan will be displayed at Ford World Headquarters for the following 10 years.

Service letter to Model T owners after the release of the Model A



Dear Sir:—
We're writing this letter to you today because we want to help you get your money out of your Model T.
It's still as good a car as it was the day the new Model A Ford was announced and there's no need to sacrifice it.
Eight model T Ford is still used by more people than any other automobile. Eight million are in active service right now and many of them can be driven one, two, three and five years and even longer.

Bring your car to us and let us look it over. You'll be surprised to see how little it costs to put it in tip-top shape.

New fenders, for instance, cost from \$3.50 to \$5.00 each, with a labor charge of \$1.00 to \$2.50. Tuning up the motor and replacing commutator case, brush and vibrator points costs only \$1.00, with a small charge for material. Brake shoes can be installed and emergency brakes equalized for a labor charge of only \$1.25. A labor charge of \$4.00 to \$5.00 will cover the overhauling of the front axle, rebushing springs and spring perches, and straightening, aligning and adjusting wheels.

The labor charge for overhauling the average rear axle runs from \$5.75 to \$7.00. Grinding valves and cleaning carbon can be done for \$3.00 to \$4.00. A set of four new pistons and rings cost only \$7.00. For a labor charge of \$2.00 to \$2.50. Very truly yours,
