**The 2018 MAFCA CONVENTION** was hosted by the Sonoma A's in Sparks, Reno Nevada from Saturday 23rd June - Friday 29th June. Reno is situated 4,506 ft above sea level, and with so many of the Model A fraternity in their senior years we had to be aware of altitude sickness. Also how our vehicles would perform at this altitude.

There were 560 official registrations (that is a lot of Model A Fords in one place at any one time). So you are looking at well over 1,000 people in attendance at this function.

We were all accommodated at the Nugget Hotel and Casino, a 29 story complex right in the middle of town. From the moment I arrived until the completion of the event there was always somewhere to go or something to do.

#### Saturday June 23rd.

I checked into the Hotel around noon, I had previously arranged to go on the Lake Tahoe Dinner Cruise that afternoon. Buses picked us up from the Casino at 1530 and drove us up to Lake Tahoe approximately a 45 mins drive to the lake. (6,225ft.)
