


The Keith Capps Story

Hello Rob, I thought this might interest some Model A'ers.

My twin brother, Don and I have clocked up a fair amount of Model A Ford experience over the last seventy-five years. In 1943 we were photographed standing beside our parents Model A Ford. We lived on the family farm 9 miles from Cowra N.S.W. Shopping on Fridays and church on Sundays were the main trips. When petrol was rationed during the war the Model A was fitted with a small extra fuel tank to hold petrol for cold starting before being switched to and run on kerosene, which was available for the farm tractors. For the first six months the Model A transported us to school when we started in 1947. My Mother was a competent driver and Don and I were driving around the paddocks and lanes when 8 years old. After leaving school we learned to shear sheep and as soon as obtaining driver's licences we drove to work in a Model A, no more pushbike or horse. My fathers favourite Model A was one that he called 1931 New Beauty, but it was in fact 1930 Town Sedan, he loved that car and it was early 1960's before he pensioned it off. In the recent photo we are standing beside my 1928 AR Ford Phaeton which is identical to the original family one. Having two Model A's and only able to drive one at a time can be a problem, so when needed Don drives one, I think he knows how! Keith Capps
