Wednesday Wanderers 7th August Report Prince Henry Hospital

Disappointing turnout for the PHH tour with only 9 members present on such a beautiful winter's day. After coffee we departed from Eddy Ave to Little Bay. Our tour guides were the 2 Annes, one an ex nurse and the other a volunteer. They gave an interesting talk on the history of the Coast Hospital established in 1881 on the sand dunes above Little Bay as a result of a smallpox epidemic in Sydney Town. It started out as a Tent Hospital, later becoming galvanized iron wards where sick returning soldiers from the Great War were isolated and allowed to recuperate as the coast hospital was far from Sydney. Later six wards were built from sand & cement bricks from the Botany brick yard. In 1934 The Coast Hospital was renamed The Prince Henry Hospital in recognition of the visit of the Duke of Gloucester (The son of King George 5th). PHH



at its peak had 700 beds in 6 wards becoming the largest General Hospital in Australia. We toured the extensive displays of past hospital infrastructure, and the only working Iron Lung in Australia. Then we walked to the Nurses War Memorial Chapel dedicated to those who served. After our tour we found a lovely café just across the road for lunch.

Wednesday 24th July 1929

90 years ago

The two-millionth Model A Ford rolled off the production line. Also called the A-Model Ford or the A, and A-bone among rodders and customizers, this automobile was the second huge success for the Ford Motor Company, after its predecessor, the Model T. Prices for the Model A ranged from US\$385 for a roadster to US\$1400 for the top-of-the-line



Town Car. The engine was a water-cooled L-head inline 4-cylinder with a displacement of 201 cu in (3.3 I). This engine provided 40 hp (30 kW; 41 PS). Top speed was around 65 mph (105 km/h). The Model A had a 103.5 in (2,630 mm) wheelbase with a final drive ratio of 3.77:1. The transmission was a conventional 3-speed sliding gear manual unsynchronised unit with a single speed reverse. The Model A had 4 -wheel mechanical drum brakes. The 1930 and 1931 models were available with stainless steel radiator cowling and headlamp housings. The Model A came in a wide variety of styles including a Coupe (Standard and Deluxe), the Business Coupe, Sport Coupe, Roadster Coupe (Standard and Deluxe), Convertible Cabriolet, Convertible Sedan, Phaeton (Standard and Deluxe), Tudor Sedan (Standard and Deluxe), Town Car, Fordor (2-window) (Standard and Deluxe), Fordor (3-window) (Standard and Deluxe), Victoria, Station Wagon, Taxicab, Truck, and Commercial. The Model A was the first Ford to use the standard set of driver controls with conventional clutch and brake pedals, throttle, and gearshift. Previous Fords used controls that had become uncommon to drivers of other makes. The Model A's fuel tank was situated in the cowl, between the engine compartment's fire wall and the dash panel. It had a visual fuel gauge, and the fuel flowed to the carburetor by gravity. A rear-view mirror was optional. In cooler climates, owners could purchase an aftermarket cast iron unit to place over the exhaust manifold to provide heat to the cab. A small door provided adjustment of the amount of hot air entering the cab. The Model A was the first car to have safety glass in the windshield. Model A production ended in March, 1932, after 4,858,644 had been made in all body styles. Its successor was the Model B, which featured an updated 4-cylinder engine, as well as the Model 18, which introduced Ford's new flathead (sidevalve) V8 engine.
