


Pre WW₂ Car Show Sunday 5th April @ Cronulla.



The restoration of an A400

Mal Bradley has seen a dream come true with the completion of his total restoration of an A400. This is now the second A400 in the club, and they are a very rare Model A. The car was imported from the US some years ago by Victorian Model A enthusiast, who then offered it to Mal. Mal was so excited to get the opportunity to acquire an A400, something he had wanted for over 40 years he did not realise the amount of restoration required to get this car back on the road. In hindsight he now would not have taken it on,.



The restoration commenced in 2013, and took six long years to complete at the end of 2019.

Some details:

- Engine was reconditioned by Bob Croft, but Mal assembled the motor.
- The chassis, running gear, wood work, and paint work were all completed by Mal
- He ordered a Le Baron Bonney interior and hood, which after a lot of effort installed himself. Lots of skinned knuckles and colourful language during this phase of the resto. He did have to get the services of a pro to resew the arm rests so they would fit
- The car is a beautiful restoration, and Mal is not that keen in taking it out of the garage after the amount of blood, sweat and tears that have gone into the job.

Well done Mal, this is a beautiful car and looking forward to seeing it along side Alan Hale's A400 in the future.
