

The Wanderer's Visit New Airport Construction At Badgery's Creek - 3rd March 21

The Wednesday Wanderers turned out in force to visit to the Western Sydney Airport Experience Centre at 100 Eaton Road Luddenham. The Centre is a community engagement and education hub where one can discover how the Western Sydney International Airport will help shape the future of Western Sydney.

Superbly organised by Treasurer Robert Brown, most of us managed to navigate to the assembly area without trauma and also on time (well done Mr Davis).

We had three Model A's turn out. A black 1929 Sports Coupe owned by Ron and Gail Huckstepp, a grey 1930 Fordor owned by Peter and Jenny Thompson and a yellow 1931 Tudor owned By Bill and Linda Daws. In addition there was Russ Johnson's 1942 Fargo military truck. The running gear for this was made by Chrysler and the body was made by TJ Richards in Adelaide. The vehicle is well maintained but is clearly a loved, unrestored vehicle. Interestingly it has a hinged panel in the roof of the cabin for the operation of a machine gun should it be needed.

The information centre is a most impressive building with many information screens to look at plus an interesting commentary provided by the staff. We understood that the new airport is intended to be finished by 2026. Certainly there was a hive of activity noticed in constructing the extensive surrounds.

For lunch we ventured to the Workers Hubertus Country Club which is a large building sitting out in the countryside by itself without another building in sight. It has at the front a medium size lake which is usually occupied by ducks and other water birds. But on the day it was occupied by radio controlled model sailing boats in a contest by a group of retired gentlemen having the fun of their lives. Lunch was most enjoyable in the company of others.

Motoring home on the M7 and M2 we came to where a sign indicated turn left for Pennant Hills. This turn however took us down into the new tunnel linking the M2 to the M1 and we emerged much further on at Hornsby. Apart from that we had a great day. Thank you Robert.


